## A GUIDE TO THE MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE

<u>Thoughts on Worship</u> – "Gravity in worship doesn't mean being stern or grim. And gladness in worship doesn't mean being frivolous or superficial. If our God is both inestimably glorious and infinitely happy, our worship will have both gravity and gladness, both substance and satisfaction" (John Piper).

<u>The Confession of Faith</u> – We regularly confess together the "faith which was once for all handed down to the saints" (Jude 3); that is, we publicly state together what we believe to be true about God and reality, particularly regarding creation and salvation. Two phrases in the Apostles' Creed often confuse Christians: believing in "the holy catholic church" is not a recognition of the Roman Catholic Church as the one truth church, but rather is a commitment to the spiritual unity of the visible and universal ("catholic") church. The phrase "He descended into hell" refers to Christ's bearing the wrath of God on our behalf on the cross and continuing under the power of death till the third day. It is not a reference to Jesus going to hell to preach to the souls there.

<u>The Sacrament of Baptism</u> – This morning we have the privilege of worshipping God in word and sacrament. The sacrament of baptism was ordained by Jesus, "not only for the solemn admission of the party baptized into the visible church; but also, to be unto him a sign and seal of the covenant of grace, of his ingrafting into Christ, of regeneration, of remission of sins, and of his giving up unto God, through Jesus Christ, to walk in newness of life" (Westminster Confession of Faith, 28.1). This morning, Cheryl Berthelsen is baptized upon her profession of faith in Jesus. As she answers publicly the membership questions she affirmed before the elders and receives the outpoured water of baptism, be renewed in your assurance of God's grace to you in Christ and in your commitment to him and his church this new year.

1. Do you acknowledge yourself to be a sinner in the sight of God, justly deserving His displeasure, and without hope save in His sovereign mercy?

2. Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do you receive and rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the Gospel?

3. Do you now resolve and promise, in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit, that you will endeavor to live as becomes a follower of Christ?

4. Do you promise to support the Church in its worship and work to the best of your ability?

5. Do you submit yourself to the government and discipline of the Church, and promise to study its purity and peace?
