The Heidelberg Catechism #29-30

Leader: Why is the Son of God called “Jesus,” meaning “savior”?

Leader and People: Because he saves us from our sins: and because salvation is not to be sought or found in anyone else.

Leader: Do those who look for their salvation and security in saints, in themselves, or elsewhere really believe in the only savior Jesus?

Leader and People: No. Although they boast of being his, by their actions they deny the only savior, Jesus. Either Jesus is not a perfect savior, or those who in true faith accept this savior have in him all they need for their salvation.
