POPC ATHLETIC FIELD RESERVATION POLICY: Members of Pear Orchard Presbyterian Church may request the use of the athletic fields for the upcoming school year beginning July 15. Between October 15 and April 15, reserved time slots are 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. each weekday afternoon.
