Heidelberg Catechism #26-28

Pastor: What do you believe when you say, "I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth"?

Pastor and People: That the eternal Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who out of nothing created heaven and earth and all that is in them, and who still upholds and governs them by His eternal counsel and providence, is, for the sake of Christ His Son, my God and my Father. In Him I trust so completely as to have no doubt that He will provide me with all things necessary for body and soul, and will also turn to my good whatever adversity He sends me in this life of sorrow. He is able to do so as almighty God, and willing also as a faithful Father.

Pastor: What do you understand by the providence of God?

Pastor and People: God's providence is His almighty and ever present power, whereby, as with His hand, He still upholds heaven and earth and all creatures, and so governs them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and barren years, food and drink, health and sickness, riches and poverty, indeed, all things, come not by chance but by His fatherly hand.

WE WELCOME TO OUR PULPIT THIS MORNING DR. E. CALVIN BEISNER. He is Founder, President, and National Spokesman of The Cornwall Alliance for the Stewardship of Creation, a network of nearly 70 evangelical scholars—natural scientists, economists, theologians, and others—dedicated to teaching about Biblical earth stewardship, economic development for the poor, and the Christian gospel and worldview. He has served as a ruling elder in congregations of the Presbyterian Church in America and the Orthodox Presbyterian Church. He was associate professor of interdisciplinary studies on the application of Biblical worldview, theology, and ethics to economics, government, and public policy at Covenant College in Lookout Mountain, Georgia, from 1992–2000, and associate professor of historical theology and social ethics, teaching church history, ethics, apologetics, logic, and systematic theology at Knox Theological Seminary in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, from 2000–2008. He and his wife of 37 years, Debby, have seven children, and their eleventh grandchild is due in January.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY UPDATES: We are so thankful to the LORD to be able to re-start most of our regular ministries at POPC. During this re-start, we have had the opportunity to evaluate how we are doing in all of our ministry plans and have decided to make a few logistical changes that impacts you and your children. There will no longer be ChurchTime offered for the 4-year-old class, which means they will stay in worship for the entire service. This is more consistent with their inclusion in Cherub Choir on Sunday nights and Wednesday night Catechism. Our 2 and 3-year-old Church Time will be moving to the nursery building, for better security and safety. Parents will need to drop them off there when we dismiss from the morning worship service.
