MISSIONARIES OF THE WEEK

Esaie and Natacha Etienne Living Stone Reformed Ministry, Haiti/Dominican Republic

Esaie has an MDiv from Reformed Theological Seminary (RTS) Orlando and is an ordained minister of the PCA in the Southwest Florida Presbytery. Since 1993, he has been in church planting ministry in South Florida, Central Florida, and Haiti. The ministry is comprised of church planting, leadership training, and mercy ministry. This includes a school for children, a medical mission, and a children's home. Due to unprecedented threats of harm in the country, the Etiennes are moving to the Dominican Republic, the neighboring country which shares the same island with Haiti. Pray that they will be able to effectively continue serving the ministries they work with in Haiti, and for God's blessing on the service initiatives they plan to start in the Dominican Republic.
