THE APOSTLES' CREED

Jude tells us to "contend earnestly for the faith which was once handed down to the saints" (Jude 3). But what is this faith? For what are we to contend? This ancient creed is one of the summaries of apostolic teaching the church has used in a variety of forms since the 2nd century for catechism, baptismal confession, and worship. The Apostles' Creed reminds us that there is a content to our faith; being "sincere" is not enough, for you can be "sincerely" wrong! As we recite this together, we remind ourselves of the basics of what we believe. The Christian faith is Trinitarian - we believe that there are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are one God, the same in substance, equal in power and glory. Two phrases in the creed can be confusing. We believe in the "holy catholic church" - not the Roman Catholic church, but the universal church across the world, all the saints everywhere who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Lord and Savior. Pear Orchard Presbyterian Church is not first and foremost an American church (thus we do not have an American flag in our worship services), but is a part of the catholic (i.e., universal) church. Note also that when we confess that Jesus "descended into hell," we do not mean that for three days His human soul was in hell or purgatory giving the damned a second chance. When Jesus died, His soul went immediately to be with His Father in heaven (Luke 23:43). This phrase in the Creed rather refers to the fact that Jesus suffered the wrath of God for His people on the cross, and that His body was in the grave for three days.
