A GUIDE TO MORNING WORSHIP

<u>The Worship of God</u> – Hebrews 12:28-29 declares, "Therefore, since we receive a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe; for our God is a consuming fire." As you enter into worship this day, remember these truths: 1) Our salvation is freely given – we did nothing to deserve or earn the kingdom given to us. 2) We worship in response to His mercy and grace, as well as to His absolute perfection and holiness. 3) Acceptable worship is offered according to God's' word, from the heart, and is a beautiful mixture of rejoicing and reverence, thankfulness and reverent fear.

<u>The Call to Worship</u> – In worship, as in salvation, God takes the initiative with His people to meet with them and speak to them. He draws near to them and calls them to worship Him in the splendor of holiness. This call is at the same time an invitation and a command – a privilege and a responsibility. Our highest duty is our greatest delight!

The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs

O Father You Are Sovereign – Margaret Clarkson suffered greatly throughout her life. She had convulsive migraine headaches and was diagnosed with juvenile arthritis at the age of three. Yet she was still able to confess that God is "the Lord of human pain." She grew up in St. John's Presbyterian Church in Toronto, Canada, the city in which she spent most of her life. She remained unmarried her entire life and reflected upon the gift of singleness in her book, So You're Single! Clarkson remarked that successful hymns must possess six characteristics. 1) Good hymns are God-centered, not mancentered. 2) Good hymns are doctrinal in content and theologically sound, rooted securely in Scripture. 3) Good hymns present words of beauty, dignity and simplicity. 4) Good hymns are adult in word and tone. 5) Good hymns display a precision of poetic technique and expression. 6) Good hymns turn the heart heavenward. May the Lord enable us to sing good hymns with a heaven-turned heart!

Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken – John Newton's beautiful hymn reminds us that God's care for His people under the Old Covenant is the same as His care for us under the New Covenant. Newton takes Old Testament imagery and applies it to the church (Ps. 87:3; Isa. 33:20-21; etc.).
