The Confession of Faith

Belgic Confession, Article 1; WSC #6

Pastor: How many Gods are there?

We all believe with the heart and confess with the mouth, that there is one only, simple and spiritual Being, which we call God; and that He is eternal, incomprehensible, invisible, immutable, infinite, almighty, perfectly wise, just, good, and the overflowing fountain of all good.

And we believe that there are three persons in the Godhead; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one God, the same in substance, equal in power and glory.
